Who are we?

Youth Health services are funded by NSW Health and are currently provided to young people aged 12-24 years, who are connected to the WSLHD catchment area.

The primary target group for service provision is young people who are marginalised, disadvantaged or at risk, with a particular focus on young people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.

We take a strengths based, harm minimisation approach that is respectful and supportive of clients taking responsibility for their health care and making decisions accordingly.

We provide information, referral and support around:

- Alcohol and other drugs
- Sexual health
- Nutrition and physical activity
- Mental health
- Dental health
- Physical health
- Accommodation and homelessness

What we offer:



Worker on Duty (WOD) providing information, referral and support



Basic needs including shower facilities, laundry, postal drop and food



Generalist counselling for young people aged 12-20



Health care coordination



Sexual health information, pregnancy testing, support, condom distribution and referral



Youth friendly GP available by appointment



Nursing, immunisation, general checkups and referral



Health education and groups provided for young people on site and at other services



Community training and inservices to build the capacity of community workers



Dental clinics, information and referral

Enquiries and Referrals:

We accept self referrals and assisted referrals through parents, family members, friends, GPs, school teachers counsellors, or other service providers, with the young person's consent.

Referrals can be made via phone or in person through our Worker on Duty (WOD).

All services provided by Youth Health are **FREE**.
